Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
 - (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
3. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
4. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
5. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on

request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—

- (a) a holographic mark, or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.

6. The responsible person must ensure that—

- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

7. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

8. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 7 —

- (a) “duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
- (b) “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula —
$$P=D+(D \times V)$$

where —

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence —
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) “value added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

9. Where the permitted price given by paragraph (b) of paragraph 8 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

10. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by paragraph (b) of paragraph 8 on a day (“the first day”) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (“the second day”) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.
11. The admission of children, that is persons aged under 18, to the exhibition of any film shall be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by the film classification body designated by section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984.
12. If at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity each such individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

a) General – all four licensing objectives (b,c,d,e):

- Strong management controls and effective training so that all staff are aware of the licensing objectives and in particular ensure that there is no under age drinking, drunkenness on the premises or in public, use of drugs, violent or anti-social behaviour and that children are protected.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder:

- Responsible management of the premises by keeping to capacity levels, training and supervision staff and adopting best practice guides e.g. adhering to the BBPA and Portman Group on drinks strategy. The National Alcohol Harm Reduction Strategy Tool Kit and other voluntary codes of practice.
- Provision of secure deposit boxes for confiscated items.
- Provision of litter bins and other security measures e.g. lighting outside the premises.
- Toughened glass will be used in the premises where available.(added at hearing 24/8/2015)

c) Public safety:

- Risk management assessment checked weekly and effective responsible management at all times. Provision of general staff levels to secure safety of the premises and customers. Training and supervision of those employed.
- Adoption of best practice guidelines e.g. The National Alcohol Harm Reduction Strategy Tool Kit and other voluntary codes of practice e.g. the BBPA and Portman Group point of sale promotions.
- Regular testing and certification if appropriate of all procedures, appliances and systems pertinent to safety.
- Staff will regularly monitor the external areas during the hours of trading.(added at hearing 24/8/2015)
- Glasses, plates and cutlery will be cleared away promptly from the external areas.(added at hearing 24/8/2015)

d) The prevention of public nuisance:

- Responsible management at all times. Training and supervision to prevent incidents of public nuisance.
- Regular visits to all parts of the premises including the exterior and delivery area.
- Adoption of best practice guides – NAHRS Toolkit and other voluntary codes of practice e.g. the BBPA and Portman Group point of sale promotions.
- Management of people including staff and traffic arriving and leaving the premises.
- Liaison with public and private transport providers.
- External lighting and security lighting installed.
- Collection and management of litter and effective ventilation systems to prevent nuisance from odour.

e) The protection of children from harm:

- Provision of sufficient staff to secure the protection of children from harm with appropriate training. Adoption of best practice guides (Public Place Charter)
- Children must be accompanied by an adult.
- A challenge 21 policy will be employed whereby a person who appears to be under 21 years of age and is attempting to purchase alcohol, will be asked provide identification. The only type of identification that will be accepted is a passport, photocard driving licence, military identification, EU identity card or PASS approved identification. Staff will be trained in this policy and records of that training will be kept.(added at hearing 24/8/2015).
- Children will be permitted until 9pm (21:00) unless they are taking a meal or attending a function, where they will be permitted to stay until the end of the meal or function.(added at hearing 24/8/2015)

Annex 3 - Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority:

Determined on: 6th September 2005

Decision: Licence granted in the terms set out above subject to the following conditions:-

3. The Beer Garden to be closed at 23:00 hours on all days of the week.
4. Prominent, clear and legible notices to be displayed at all exits requesting the public to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the area quietly.

Determined on: 24th August 2015

Decision: Licence granted in terms set out above subject to the following conditions:-

1. To vary the layout and design of the premises in accordance with the plan submitted drawing 165-100 dated 9/2/2015.
2. To allow the external area/patio(a second beer garden in effect) at the front of the premises as defined in the plan submitted, drawing 1605 -100 dated 9/2/2015.
3. The beer gardens shall both be closed at 23:00 on all days of the week.
4. Not to empty bulk glass into external bins/containers between the hours of 22:00 hours and 08:00 hours.

5. The addition of the conditions indicated to the operating schedule and the removal of those requested by the applicant.
