Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
 - (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
3. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
4. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
5. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on

request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—

- (a) a holographic mark, or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.

6. The responsible person must ensure that—

- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

7. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

8. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 7 —

- (a) “duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
- (b) “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula —
$$P=D+(D \times V)$$

where —

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence —
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) “value added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

9. Where the permitted price given by paragraph (b) of paragraph 8 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

10. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by paragraph (b) of paragraph 8 on a day (“the first day”) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (“the second day”) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.
11. The admission of children, that is persons aged under 18, to the exhibition of any film shall be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by the film classification body designated by section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984.
12. If at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity each such individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

a) General – all four licensing objectives (b,c,d,e):

Following an assessment of the premises and its surrounding area the following is proposed:

- 30 minutes ‘drinking up time’ will allow appropriate dispersal, use of lavatories etc
- In order to further the licensing objectives, the licensee reserves the right to move the fire appliances, AWP machines, cigarette machines and/ or any other similar objects temporarily in a fixed location which may impact on the ability of individuals on the premises to use exits or escape routes without impediment.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder:

- The exterior areas of the pub are illuminated.
- The licensees/ staff monitor customer behaviour especially during busy periods, with additional attention being given to the garden area during the summer months, by management/staff and glass collectors.
- There is CCTV monitoring activity in the customer car park and at the front of the pub. The customer car park is locked off outside trading hours.
- Drug Prevention measures are employed at this house.

c) Public safety

- A health and safety risk assessment has been made with a full property inspection to take place every month.
- The pub is equipped with illuminated exit signs and a fire detection system throughout the main building.
- All fire fighting equipment and portable electrical appliances are tested annually and there are current electric and gas certificates in place.
- There is a first aider and first aid facilities available and an accident/incident book for staff and public is maintained on site.
- Staff are trained in our disability policy and assistance is always available for disabled persons.

d) The prevention of public nuisance:

- Staff regularly monitor noise levels especially if entertainment is being provided.

- The pub has a lobbied entrance which reduces noise emission.
- When required, staff organise taxis to transport customers home and when necessary, customers are seen off the premises and encouraged to disperse quietly.
- The fact that this public house is a detached property assists in minimising noise transfer to neighbours.
- The local bus service helps with the dispersal of customers at night.
- Customers are not permitted to leave the premises with open drinking vessels.
- The customer car park is locked off outside of trading hours.

e) The protection of children from harm:

- Unaccompanied children are not permitted on the premises.
- The garden/children's play area is fenced in and notices are positioned in the garden reminding parents to supervise their children. When the garden is in use and as part of our risk assessment, there is a daily inspection of the children's' play area and play equipment with special attention paid to inspecting the garden for any broken glass etc.
- When demand dictates, the function room can provide children's refreshment, which reduces pedestrian movement across the customer car park.
- The AWP is close to the bar and in sight of bar staff. Cigarettes are only available from behind the counter.
- The pub has a children's menu and selection of soft drinks to help promote family atmosphere.

Annex 3 - Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

Determined on: 27th July 2005

Decision(s): Licence Granted in part.

The hours granted for the supply of alcohol also apply to: the playing of recorded or live music and indoor sporting events. All subject to the following conditions:

1. PA system not to be used in the garden for amplified music.
2. Karaoke and live music in the public house to finish at 23:00 hours and in the function room at 00:00 hours (midnight) or the licensed hours, whichever is the earlier.
3. The children's Play Area to be fenced.
4. The main garden area (beyond the car park) to be closed to customers by 23:30 hours on all days of the week except Sundays, when it will be closed at 23:00 hours.
5. Prominent notices to be displayed in the garden to warn parents of the danger of water hazards.
6. Prominent, clear and legible notices will be displayed at all exits requesting the public to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly
