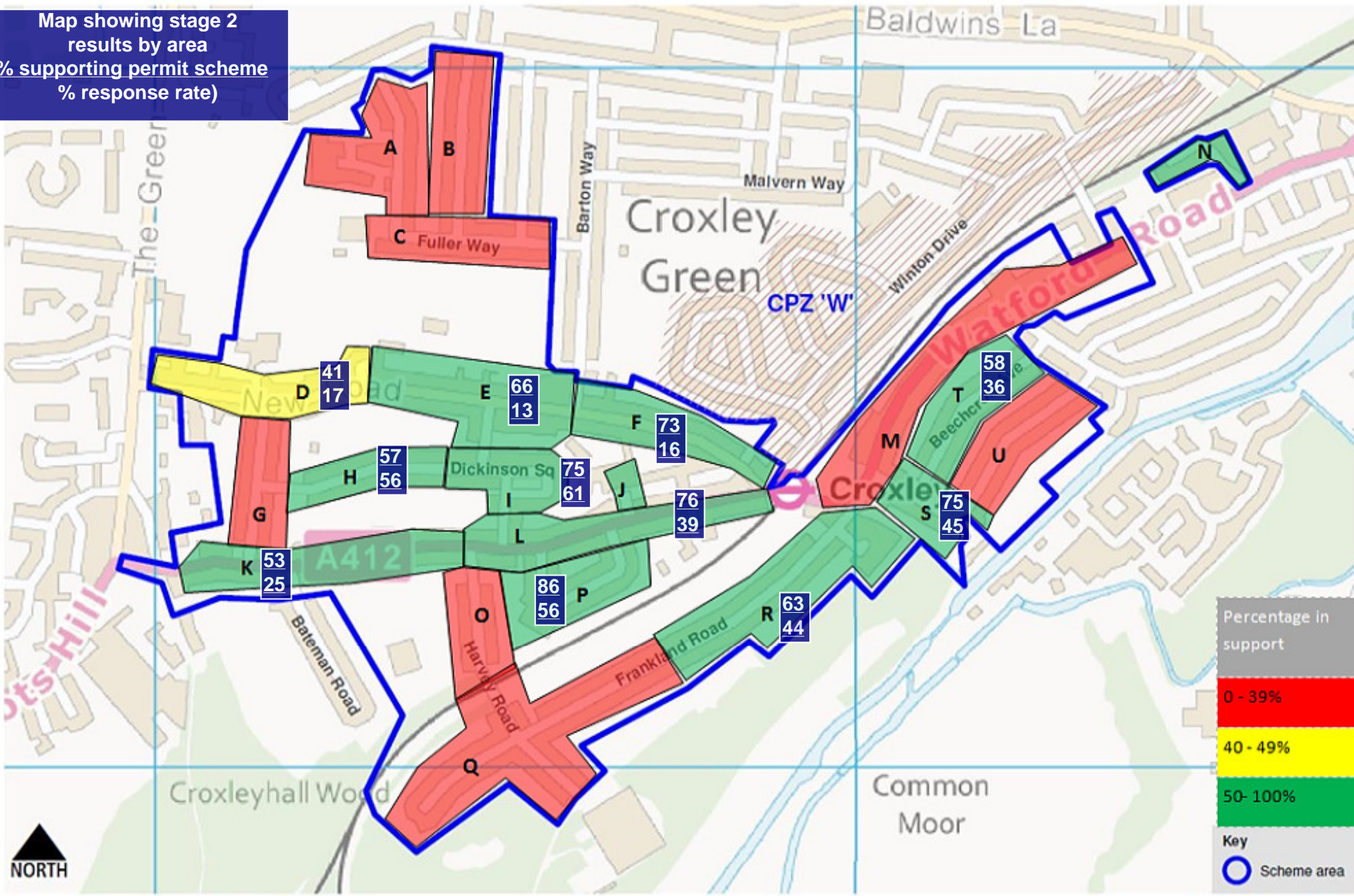

YOUR VIEWS ON CROXLEY GREEN AREA PARKING PROPOSALS

The District Council carried out a parking consultation in roads around Croxley Green in 2017 as part of an ongoing parking study in the area.

- It is clear from this consultation that residents in a large number of streets feel that there is a need for new parking controls. You can see the proposed scheme area, list of streets and results of consultation here: <https://www.threerivers.gov.uk/egcl-page/parking-consultations>
- The council is now seeking the views of local residents and businesses, as well as the general public, through a second stage of informal consultation.
- You can view and comment on the draft initial proposals, which resulted from the analysis of the consultations.

Three Rivers District Council, Three Rivers House, Northway, Rickmansworth, Herts, WD3 1RL (8.30am to 5.00pm, Monday to Thursday, 8.30am to 4:30pm Fridays)

- This scheme does not include roads where the survey indicated that residents did not see a parking problem or where there was no majority in support of new controls.
- Comments on the proposals will help us appraise each of the schemes and enable us to develop final proposals which will be taken through to statutory consultations.
- The District Council would like to hear from as many people as possible so that we can take into account everyone's views.

- A simple survey form is attached together with a freepost envelope (NO STAMP REQUIRED). Please complete the form and return it to us. You can comment in writing by letter or email. Please include your name and postal address in any response, for our records.

- Please note that this scheme is being developed in response to local requests and while the District Council will seek views, it will not force the introduction of parking schemes unless there is general support for a scheme.
- You may also choose to include your contact details by email, or telephone if you prefer. Anonymous responses will be recorded, but the data provided may not necessarily be used towards any decision. All personal data held by the Council is treated as strictly confidential. Individuals have a right on written request to obtain a copy of such personal data relating to him/her held by the Council as is required under Data Protection legislation. Permit Prices

The introduction of a Controlled Parking Zone / Resident Parking Zone will require residents and their visitors to purchase a permit **if** they need to park a vehicle during the hours of control on the road.

The charges for annual permits could be as follows. ***(Please note the charges and operating days/ hours will be finalised if the scheme is implemented)***

Monday to Friday

1st Permit - £30

2nd Permit - £55

Residents who are holders of a Blue Badge (disabled driver) and have a vehicle registered at the property may receive their first permit without charge.

Visitor Vouchers

Each household is eligible for visitor's vouchers, which come in books of 10 at a cost of £12 per book (£1.20 per voucher). There is half price discount for residents over 60 years of age. Proof of age will be required when applying for the discounted price.

Other types of permits are available to specific types of visitors e.g. Doctors Permits and Health visitor's permits.
