### **Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions**

- 1. No supply of alcohol shall be made under this Premises Licence at a time:
  - (a) when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the Premises Licence.
  - (b) when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his or her personal licence is suspended.
- Every supply of alcohol under the Premises Licence shall be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 3. Observance of BBFC age classification for the showing of films and videos.

### **Additional Mandatory Licensing Conditions**

As a result of the Policing and Crime Act 2009 additional mandatory conditions now apply to all premises licences and club premises certificates. These additional conditions are listed below.

- 1. (1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
  - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children—
    - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
      - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
      - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
    - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
    - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
    - (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on—
      - (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
      - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
    - (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favorable manner.

- 2. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- **3.** The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- **4.** (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
  - (2) The policy must require individuals, who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy), to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
- 5. The responsible person shall ensure that-
  - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
    - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
    - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
    - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
  - (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

The conditions 1-3 and 5 do not apply where the premises licence or club certificate authorises the sale by retail or supply of alcohol only for consumption off the premises.

#### Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

### A) General – all four licensing objectives:

- The variations extend the opening hours but do not radically alter the facilities and opening hours available (with the grant of extensions or 'Special Orders of Exemption' from time to time) before the Licensing Act 2003.
- The additional facilities proposed create opportunities to provide a broad range of entertainment and reduce the emphasis on alcohol.
- The additional facilities proposed do not in our assessment present any significant additional risks in relation to the licensing objectives and no additional steps are intended.

### B) The Prevention of Crime and Disorder:

There will be a 30 minute 'winding down' time after the last permitted sale of alcohol.

### C) Public Safety:

### D) The prevention of Public Nuisance:

### E) The Protection of Children From Harm:

The restrictions set out in the Licensing Act 2003 will apply.

### Annex 3 - Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority:

Determined on: 5<sup>th</sup> October 2005

#### Decision:

Licence granted in the terms set out above subject to the following conditions.

- 1. The performance of live and recorded music shall be limited to a maximum of 3 three days each week apart from December.
- 2. When live and recorded music is being performed the windows and, so far as possible, the doors of the function room to be kept closed after 21 00 hours.
- 3. There shall be no karaoke and there shall be no loud speakers outside.
- 4. The premises will not show videos or television transmissions that are unsuitable for persons under 18 years of age.
- 5. The garden to be closed from 23.00 hours and the external lighting reduced.
- 6. Prominent clear and legible notices will be displayed at all exits requesting the public to respect the needs of local residents by parking considerately and not parking on the verges, and to leave the premises and the area quietly.
- 7. The car park should be marked out to encourage improved utilisation of this area.
- 8. The mandatory conditions shall apply.
- 9. The provisions of the Operating Schedule shall apply.
- 10. The embedded restriction removed.
