Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

1. No supply of alcohol shall be made under this Premises Licence at a time:
 - (a) when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the Premises Licence.
 - (b) when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his or her personal licence is suspended.
2. Every supply of alcohol under the Premises Licence shall be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Additional Mandatory Licensing Conditions

As a result of the Policing and Crime Act 2009 additional mandatory conditions now apply to all premises licences and club premises certificates. Conditions 1-3 come into being as from the 6th April 2010 and conditions 4 & 5 from 1st October 2010, These additional conditions are listed below.

1. (1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
 - (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on—
 - (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
 - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
 - (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
2. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
3. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

5. The responsible person shall ensure that–

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures–

(i) beer or cider: ½ pint;

(ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and

(iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and

(b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

The conditions 1-3 and 5 do not apply where the premises licence or club certificate authorises the sale by retail or supply of alcohol only for consumption off the premises.

Annex 3 - Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority:

Determined on: 27th September 2005

Decision:

Licence granted in the terms set out above, subject to the following conditions:

1. The performance of live dance, facilities for dancing, provision of live music and facilities for entertainment, to finish at 00:00 hours (mid-night) on Fridays and Saturdays.
2. All windows and doors will be closed at 23:00.
3. The patio area to be closed by 23:00 hours and the lighting turned off.
4. Doors to be closed to new customers at 23:30.
5. Prominent, clear and legible notices to be displayed at all exits requesting the public to respect the needs of local residents and leave the premises and the area quietly.

Recorded Music.

Recorded music is allowed by way of an embedded right, on the condition that it is not provided in the following terms:-

1. To any extent for members of the public, or a section of the public, or for consideration with a view to profit.
2. The premises are made available for the purpose or the purposes which include the purpose of, enabling the playing of recorded music.
3. It takes place in the presence of an audience or spectators.
4. It is provided for the purpose or purposes which include the purpose of entertaining that audience or those spectators, and
5. It is not incidental to some other activity which is not itself 'a description of entertainment' or the provision of entertainment facilities.
