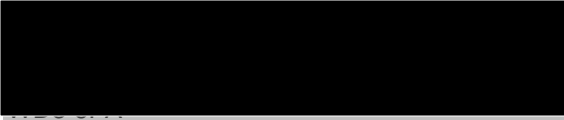

Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions

For the purposes of this schedule

“the act” means the Licensing Act 2003

“Anti-Social Behaviour” has the meaning given in Section 36 of the Anti-Social Behaviour Act 2003;

“Disability” has the meaning given in section 1 of the Disability Discrimination Act 1995;

“Relevant Premises” has the meaning given in paragraphs (a) and (b) of the definition in section 153(4) of the Act (the relevant parts of which are attached to this licence).

Mandatory Condition – s19 of the Licensing Act 2003

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence;

- (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made by person who holds a personal licence.

MANDATORY CONDITIONS SPECIFIED BY THE LICENSING ACT 2006 (MANDATORY LICENSING CONDITIONS) ORDER 2010 AS AMENDED BY THE LICENSING ACT 2003 (MANDATORY CONDITIONS) (AMENDMENT) ORDER 2014:

Mandatory Condition 1

(1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—

- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

Mandatory Condition 2

The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

Mandatory Condition 3

(1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either -

- (a) a holographic mark, or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.

Mandatory Condition 4

The responsible person must ensure that -

- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures -
- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

Mandatory Condition 5

1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1 -
 - (a) “duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979(a);
 - (b) “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula -

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$
 Where -
 - (i) P is the permitted price,
 - (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
 - (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
 - (c) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
 - (d) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
 - (e) “valued added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994(a).
3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day (“the first day”) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (“the second day”) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

1. 30 minutes 'drinking up' time will allow appropriate dispersal, use of lavatories etc.
2. In order to further the licensing objectives the licensee reserves the right to move the fire appliances, AWP machines and or any other similar objects temporarily in a fixed location which may impact on the ability of individuals on the premises to use exits or escape routes without impediment
3. Illumination is provided to the exterior areas of the pub
4. All interior trading areas are visible to staff from behind the bar servery
5. A rota is in place for checking the toilets and toilets are checked regularly
6. The licensees and staff monitor customer behaviour especially during busy periods
7. Local ring round system in place
8. The pub is equipped with emergency lighting, illuminated exit signs and a fire detection system throughout the entire building. All fire fighting equipment is serviced annually. All portable electrical appliances are tested annually. There are current electric and gas certificates in place. Mechanical extraction is provided in the bar.
9. The pub has a first aider and first aid facilities.
10. The pub promotes a licensed taxi service to facilitate its customers making onward journeys.
11. When required, staff organise taxis to transport customers home and customers are often seen off the premises and encouraged to disperse at closing.
12. An accident/ incident book is on site for staff and public.
13. Some staff hold Basic Food Hygiene certificates.
14. Staff are trained in our disability policy and assistance is always available.
15. There are no opening windows in the bar area and all entrance doors have internal lobbies.
16. Being a detached property there are no adjoining neighbours and residential accommodation in the immediate area is minimal. This assists in minimising noise transfer to neighbours.
17. We are gradually phasing out standard glasses and replacing with toughened glass.
18. The pub has a lobbied entrance which reduces noise emission.
19. Cellar cooling condenser is positioned so as not to cause nuisance to neighbours and is sound proofed.
20. There is a 'please respect our neighbours and leave quietly' sign on display.
21. No children to be allowed on site after 21:00 hours
22. Children are not permitted in the bar, save access to the garden and use of toilets.
23. The pub has a children's menu and suitable soft drinks to promote a family atmosphere.

Annex 3 - Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

Determined on: 19th August 2005

Decision: Licence granted in the terms as outlined above subject to:

1. The garden to be closed at 23:00 hours.
2. Any live music to be terminated at 23:00 hours.
3. On special occasions and Bank Holidays (when alcohol sales are permitted after midnight) staff must closely monitor the doors to the premises and the activities of customers to try and ensure a quiet and orderly dispersal in the immediate vicinity of the premises.
4. Signage shall be posted in a prominent position at the exit requesting the public to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the area quietly.
