Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions

For the purposes of this schedule

“the act” means the Licensing Act 2003

“Anti-Social Behaviour” has the meaning given in Section 36 of the Anti-Social Behaviour Act 2003;

“Disability” has the meaning given in section 1 of the Disability Discrimination Act 1995;

“Relevant Premises” has the meaning given in paragraphs (a) and (b) of the definition in section 153(4) of the Act (the relevant parts of which are attached to this licence).

Mandatory Condition – s19 of the Licensing Act 2003

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence;

- (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made by person who holds a personal licence.

MANDATORY CONDITIONS SPECIFIED BY THE LICENSING ACT 2006 (MANDATORY LICENSING CONDITIONS) ORDER 2010 AS AMENDED BY THE LICENSING ACT 2003 (MANDATORY CONDITIONS) (AMENDMENT) ORDER 2014:

Mandatory Condition 1

(1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—

- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

Mandatory Condition 2

The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

Mandatory Condition 3

(1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either -

- (a) a holographic mark, or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.

Mandatory Condition 4

The responsible person must ensure that -

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures -

- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;

(b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and

(c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

Mandatory Condition 5

1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1 -

(a) “duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979(a);

(b) “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula -

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

Where -

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

(c) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -

- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
- (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(d) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e) “valued added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994(a).

3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day (“the first day”) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (“the second day”) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

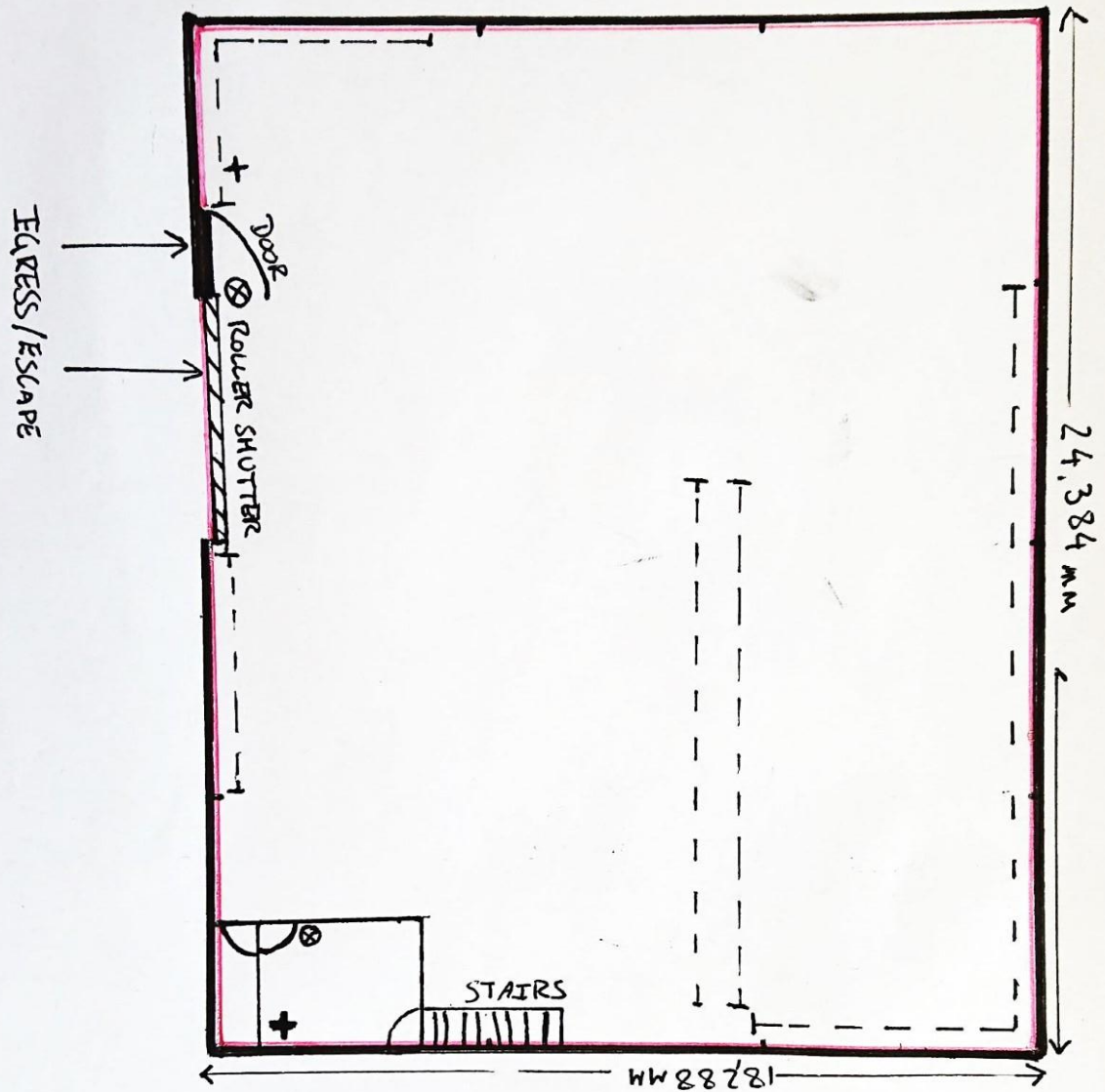
Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

1. CCTV equipment shall be installed, continually recording and maintained in good working order. All entry, exit and points of sale areas will be covered by the cameras. Recordings must be retained for a minimum of 21 days. Any recordings or images must be available for inspection and downloading immediately upon request to officers or responsible Authorities.
2. Visitors to the premises are strictly controlled by a security gate and secure doors/shutters.
3. All sales of alcohol shall be in sealed containers only, and shall not be consumed on the premises.
4. Any criminal offence, disorder or anti-social behaviour will be reported to the police immediately.
5. The premises will not give rise to any issues concerning noise nuisance, light pollution, noxious smells or litter.
6. Good clear visible signage and notices will be displayed at the premises to encourage customers to leave the premises quietly and to respect any neighbouring properties.
7. Visitor numbers at any one time will be kept at a low enough number in order to ensure that there is no additional noise, threats to community safety, litter, odour, smoke or light which could impact on people living locally and the wider community.
8. No music or entertainment will take place on the premises.
9. Refuse will be kept away from public access and bins will be provided at the entrance of the premises. All bins and rubbish will be emptied between 7am and 9pm.
10. The licence holder will aim to hold regular meetings with residents, businesses within the vicinity of the premises and also invite ward councillors to these meetings. More regular meetings will be held if any issues arise.
11. The premises shall operate a "Challenge 21" policy and any person wishing to purchase alcohol who appears to be under 21 shall be asked to produce an acceptable form of identification such as a photo-card driving licence, passport, cards bearing the PASS hologram, or military ID card. There will be clear visible signage on the premises advertising the age verification policy and customers will be informed that age and identity verification will be required at delivery in accordance with the age verification policy.
12. All online sales will have age-verification set up through a declaration tickbox. Clear advice will be promoted online with direction to www.drinkaware.co.uk
13. Entry by persons under the age of 18 is prohibited unless accompanied by an adult over the age of 18.
14. In addition to any other training, staff will be trained to prevent underage sales and will be monitored to ensure that they put their training in practice. Records of training will be made available to police or an authorised officer whilst the premises is open.
15. When deliveries are made by a courier company a log shall be kept detailing all refused sales of alcohol including the date and time, this log will be made available for inspection at the premises by the Police or an authorised officer.
16. All deliveries will be dispatched to bona fide addresses only.
17. The licence holder will ensure that the premises complies with all statutory fire safety controls, food safety regulations and all health and safety requirements to safeguard against injury and occupational ill-health. The premises will also have safe and suitable wheelchair access. The premises will also have adequate ventilation and temperature and humidity control.
