Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions

For the purposes of this schedule "the act" means the Licensing Act 2003

"Anti-Social Behaviour" has the meaning given in Section 36 of the Anti-Social Behaviour Act 2003;

"Disability" has the meaning given in section 1 of the Disability Discrimination Act 1995;

"Relevant Premises" has the meaning given in paragraphs (a) and (b) of the definition in section 153(4) of the Act (the relevant parts of which are attached to this licence).

Mandatory Condition - s19 of the Licensing Act 2003

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence;

- (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made by person who holds a personal licence.

MANDATORY CONDITIONS SPECIFIED BY THE LICENSING ACT 2006 (MANDATORY LICENSING CONDITIONS) ORDER 2010 AS AMENDED BY THE LICENSING ACT 2003 (MANDATORY CONDITIONS) (AMENDMENT) ORDER 2014:

Mandatory Condition 1

(1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—

- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;¹ A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other

person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

Mandatory Condition 2

The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

Mandatory Condition 3

(1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—

- (a) a holographic mark, or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.

Mandatory Condition 4

The responsible person must ensure that—

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—

- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;

(b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and

(c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available."

Mandatory Condition 5

1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—

- (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979(a);
- (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula—

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

where—

- (i) P is the permitted price,
 - (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
 - (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—
- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e) "valued added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994(a).

3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Mandatory Condition 6 CCTV

1. Premises licence holder must ensure that:

- a. CCTV cameras are located within the premises to cover all public areas including all entrances and.
- b. The system records clear images permitting the identification of individuals.
- c. The CCTV system is able to capture a minimum of 4 frames per second and all recorded footage must be securely retained for a minimum of 28 days.
- d. The CCTV system operates at all times while the premises are open for licensable activities. All equipment must have a constant and accurate time and date generation.
- e. The CCTV system is fitted with security functions to prevent recordings being tampered with, i.e. password protected.
- f. There are members of trained staff at the premises during operating hours able to provide viewable copies on request to police or authorised local authority officers as soon as is reasonably practicable in accordance with the Data Protection Act 1998 (or any replacement legislation).

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

1. No alcohol shall be supplied unless there is an active Designated Premises Supervisor for the premises
2. The Designated Premises Supervisor shall ensure all staff receive training into the legality and procedures of alcohol sales, prior to the undertaking of the sale of alcohol. Records to be maintained of training undertaken
3. Alcohol shall only be served on the premises ancillary to a substantive table meal or a take away meal
4. A Challenge 25 policy shall be in place in line with the mandatory conditions of a premise licence
5. CCTV to be installed at the premises. All recordings to be kept for 31 days and to show the correct date and time
6. Staff shall be trained to operate the CCTV and must be available on the premises at all opening times, and recording must be provided to an authorised officer from the police or licensing authority on request
7. No alcohol to be served to any person appearing intoxicated. Water made available and provided to patrons to promote responsible drinking
8. A refusals book shall be kept at the premises where all refusals will be logged including date and time, a description of the customer and the name of the staff member who refused the sale and the reason the sale was refused. The book shall be made available to an authorised officer on request at any time
9. Fire safety equipment provided to required standards and serviced periodically
10. Clear visible signage highlighting exit points. All exit points that will be free from obstruction whilst the premises is open to the public
11. All external doors and windows shall be kept closed during the provision of recorded music and performances of dance entertainment to prevent excessive noise break out from the premises
12. Suitable and sufficient soundproofing shall be installed and permanently retained to limit noise to adjoining properties
13. Signs shall be placed in a prominent place at the exit point of the premises requesting patrons to respect the neighbours and leave quietly
14. Deliveries and collections (including refuse and/or recycling collections) associated with the premises shall be arranged between the hours of 08:00 to 20:00 hours only
15. No children shall be permitted on the premises unless accompanied by an adult
16. A Challenge 25 scheme shall operate at the premises and all staff shall be trained in its implementation. Only photographic ID such as a UK driving licence or passport shall be treated as acceptable forms of identification.

Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

The granting of the above application is subject to the following further Conditions imposed by the Licensing sub-committee on 20 November 2020:

1. The supply of alcohol 'off sales' is only permitted when supplied off premises with a substantive meal for delivery or take away collection
2. Belly dancing is only permitted on Saturdays between 20:00 and 22:00 and is not to take place in the presence of children
3. When belly dancing takes place, appropriate screening will be in place so that it cannot be viewed externally from the street
4. The collection of take away deliveries and 'off sales' with a substantive meal is to only take place via the front door of the premises
5. Waste, including bottles and glass, will be disposed of outside the Premises into plastic bins only and is not permitted to take place at any time after 18.00 each evening or before 0800 each morning
6. No smoking to take place at the side/rear of the premises and patrons to be advised to smoke at the front of the premises
7. The perimeter of the premises should be patrolled regularly between 20:00 and 23:00 to check the level of noise emanating from the premises and if the volume of any recorded music or performance can be heard at the perimeter, it will be immediately turned down. A record will be kept to show that such checks are made which may be inspected by an authorised officer at any time
8. The premises will provide a named contact and telephone number to be made available to local residents to report any issues with regard to noise or other public nuisance caused by the premises and any such contact by a local resident will be recorded in the log book for inspection by an authorised officer at any time.
