GENERAL NOTICE OF REGISTRABLE INTERESTS

I, (INSERT NAME) Sara Bedford, a Member of Three Rivers District Council, set out below under the appropriate headings my interests, which I am required to declare under the Localism Act 2011 and the Council's Code of Conduct and I have put "none " where I have no such interests under any heading.

Registering Interests

Within 28 days of becoming a Member or your re-election or re-appointment to office you must register with the Monitoring Officer the interests which fall within the categories set out in **Table 1 (Disclosable Pecuniary Interests)** which are described in 'The [Relevant Authorities \(Disclosable Pecuniary Interests\) Regulations 2012](#)'. You should also register details of your other personal interests which fall within the categories set out in **Table 2 (Other Registerable Interests)**.

"Disclosable pecuniary interest" means an interest of yourself, or of your partner if you are aware of your partner's interest, within the descriptions set out in Table 1 below.

"Partner" means a spouse or civil partner, or a person with whom you are living as husband or wife, or a person with whom you are living as if you are civil partners.

1. You must ensure that your register of interest is kept up-to-date and within 28 days of becoming aware of any new interest, or of any change to a registered interest, notify the Monitoring Officer.
2. A 'sensitive interest' is an interest which, if disclosed, could lead to the Councillor, or a person connected with the Councillor, being subject to violence or intimidation.
3. Where you have a 'sensitive interest' you must notify the Monitoring Officer with the reasons why you believe it is a sensitive interest. If the Monitoring Officer agrees they will withhold the interest from the public register.

I recognise that it is an offence pursuant to s.34 of the Localism Act 2011 for a Member to –

- (1) fail to notify the Monitoring Officer of a disclosable pecuniary interest before the end of 28 days beginning with the date when the member became aware of the matter; or
- (2) provide information that the member knows to be false or misleading; or
- (3) provide information being reckless as to whether it is true and not misleading.

I also acknowledge that it may be a breach of the Members' Code of Conduct to:-

- (1) fail to register or disclose a disclosable pecuniary interest; or
- (2) fail to register with the Monitoring Officer any gift or hospitality with an estimated value of at least £25 within 28 days of its receipt; or
- (3) fail to register with the Monitoring Officer any significant gift or hospitality that I have

been offered but have refused to accept.
